## The blues

This is a short description how to make the quilt 'the blues'.


You need all the blues, from very light (almost white) to very dark (almost black) and every shade in between.

This quilt is made of 64 blocks, 32 A-blocks and 32 B-blocks.

Each block is made of 64 squares ( $1,5^{\prime \prime}$ without seam allowance).

Cut in total at least 4096 2" squares. Probably a lot more because you have too much light or too much dark fabric. You can use every blue scrap, the beauties and the uglies. Old, new, flowers, batiks, whimsical, childres fabrics, really, use every blue scrap.


When you paint your house, you go to the construction market.
There you can pick up swatches of different paint.
Take all the blue ones and stick them on 6 cards. Divide them in 6 levels, from dark to light.
Compare each 2 "square to this cards and make 6 piles of fabric squares.


Pick the squares for the 32 A-blocks from the corresponding piles of fabric.


| color | block A | block B |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 1 | $12 x$ | $11 x$ |
| 2 | $10 x$ | $12 x$ |
| 3 | $10 x$ | $9 x$ |
| 4 | $9 x$ | $10 x$ |
| 5 | $12 x$ | $10 x$ |
| 6 | $11 x$ | $12 x$ |

Pick the squares for the 32 B-blocks from the corresponding piles of fabric.

For the yellow: Divide each block in four quarters. Then, somewhere random in each quarter, pick one blue square and make a new one like the picture. Cut $1,25 \times 1,25^{\prime \prime}$ yellow, $1,25 \times 1,25^{\prime \prime}$ blue (use the right pile) and $1,25 \times 2$ " blue (the same blue as the small square).
Sew these together and use it as a 2 " square.
This way the yellow points are equaly divided on your quilt.



At last, sew the blocks together, quilt and bind off.
